Dwight Throop introduced **Murray Smith** who gave us a thorough overview of the oil industry from 25 years in the field.

Oil is in everything we use, including synthetic fibers, medicines, wax and lubricants. It would take 3 farms the size of Texas to grow enough cotton to replace the synthetic fibers we use.

Today world consumption is at 88 billion barrels per day (bbl/day). The discrepancy between oil consumtion and oil production is an issue in many countries. For example the U.S. consumes 20 bbl/day and produces 6. Canada consumes 2.5 bbl/day and produces 3. Saudi Arabia produces the most at 264.2 bbl/day. China has a huge shortfall of oil reserves, thus their dependence on coal. China is responsible for 50% of global CO² emissions.

Oil does not contribute to CO² emissions.

Cost to produce oil varies widely. The cost in Saudi Arabia is \$2 - \$3/barrel, the North Sea cost is \$25 - \$30 and the Tar Sands cost is \$25 - \$30. The amount consumers pay in each country varies widely as well. Canadians pay \$1/barrel and Europeans pay \$2.40, while in Venezuela consumers pay 20 cents/barrel and in India from 3 to 25 cents! Taxes and subsidies account for these wide differences.

As we near Peak Oil (demand=production) alliances and alternatives will be increasingly important.
