Special Tour

Mary Sergenese and Miriam Myers guided our tour at Mississauga Trillium Hospital. During our visit we saw a Cardiac catheterization being performed in the Cardiac Catheterization Lab. This procedure measures the function of the chambers of the heart valves, and coronary artery blood flow. During the procedure, a catheter was inserted into an artery and guided to the heart. It was most impressive to watch the Cath Lab team in action and see the on-screen activity inside the patient's heart. It was stressed to us over and over that **if you think you are having a stroke or heart attack the best action you can take is to call 911.**

The Orthopaedics and Rehabilitation Wing features: care stations distributed around the floor bringing staff closer to patients; wireless networks and integrated communications, giving better access; a state of the art rehabilitation gym and rooms that are bright and private.
